



HOPE, HEART & HOME REGISTERS WITH



September 2, HHH took a giant leap forward in helping our community's foster families by officially registering as a Partner on the new child welfare platform, **CARE PORTAL**. Regional Director of the program in South Dade, **Panos Kourtesis** (of *One More Child*) walked a team from HHH through a 90 minute training session to learn the fundamentals of this new state-wide initiative,

CARE PORTAL acts as a "gateway" to family support services to pair those in need of assistance with local faith institutions and community organizations eager to help.

HOPE, **HEART** & **HOME** is now serving as one of those "local faith institutions!"

One of our HHH parishes, *St. John Neumann*, is now registered as part of this network. (SJN will be shortly followed by *St. Louis* in Pinecrest.)



Here is a simple **7 STEP** explanation of how **CARE PORTAL** works:

- 1. A Foster Family determines they need a highchair and communicates that need to their Case Worker.
- 2. Their Case Worker enters that request on the CARE PORTAL website.
- 3. CARE PORTAL sends a request to fill that need for a highchair to the Member Churches n that foster family's zip code (in a 10 mile radius).
 - 4. Our HHH Program Administrator (**Dr. John Gentile**) receives the email and forward the request to all of his team members (Currently includes **Maria Jacques**, **Susan Dingler**, **Sabrina Lawrence**, and **Don Jackson**) to scour their parish contacts to find a high-chair OR a decision is made to purchase one.
 - 5. If a chair is located or purchased, John notifies **CARE PORTAL** that HHH (SJN) has met this request.
 - **6.** Dr.Gentile arranges a drop-off of the highchair with the originating Case Worker.
 - 7. The Case Worker delivers the chair to the Foster Family fulfilling the need.

On **Grandparents Day**, Sept. 12, 2021, three child welfare organizations came together at *St John Neumann Church* to appeal for foster parents: *Citrus Family Care Network*, the primary community-based care provider for the Department of Children and Families in Miami-Dade County and **Catholic Charities' Unaccompanied Refugee Minors Program**, and the *Hope*, *Heart & Home* ministry founded at *St. John Neumann* and now active in several parishes in South Dade.

MIAMI | Three child welfare organizations launched a recruiting event for foster parents after Sunday Masses at <u>St. John Neumann Church</u> on Grandparents Day, Sept. 12, 2021.

The three manned side-by-side information booths in the loggia of the church: <u>Catholic Charities'</u> <u>Unaccompanied Refugee Minors Program</u>, St. John Neumann's <u>Hope, Heart & Home ministry</u> and the <u>Citrus Family Care Network</u>, the primary community-based care provider for the Department of Children and Families in Miami-Dade County.

"Children in foster care desperately need safe and secure homes with caring parents," said **Hope, Heart & Home**'s **Eric Schwindeman**. "Praise God! Seven parish families answered the call and signed up to explore foster and respite parenting."

The three organizations will team up once more on Sunday, Sept. 26, for a similar recruiting event after the 8 a.m. to noon Masses at St. Louis Church in Pinecrest.

The requirements to be a foster parent include: Be at least 21 years old; be able to provide adequate bedroom space and a separate bed for each foster child; have reliable transportation; be willing to participate in a 30-hour free training; be prepared for adults in your household to undergo complete background checks; be able to meet basic resources to support the household.



Catholic Charities provides 24-hour case management, monthly stipend to help with the care of the refugee minor or youth, continuing education and more. For more information, call 305-883-3383 or visit www.ccadm.org.

Hope, Heart & Home also registered as a partner on a new child welfare platform, <u>CarePortal</u>. This new statewide initiative pairs families in need of assistance with local faith institutions and community organizations who can help meet specific requests.

"One of our HHH parishes, *St. John Neumann*, is now registered as part of this network and will be shortly followed by *St. Louis*," said Schwindeman.

CarePortal works this way: A caseworker enters a request for a foster family on the platform. Recent requests have been made for needs such as diapers, a bunk bed frame and a crib. The request goes out to all the churches registered on the site near the foster parents' zip code. The church's **CarePortal** administrator relays the need to those in the network, then responds to **CarePortal** with the part of the request the church can meet.

Dr. John Gentile is Hope, Heart & Home's **CarePortal** administrator. Those who are interested in helping with requests can reach out to him at driphngentile71@gmail.com.

The Executive Director of *Casa Valentina*, **Janice Graham** gave a passionate introduction of her facilities' services for foster children aging out of foster care to 30 *Hope*, *Heart & Home* child advocates on their monthly zoom call Monday night, September 13th.

Casa Valentina serves as a "working model of care" here in Dade County - providing safe, affordable housing and critical life skills to help teens transition into independence. Over the last 15 years, they have served over 250 youth in their residential program but havehelped thousands more in their public-private partnerships.

Ms. Graham outlined the "5 Pillars" of care *Casa Valentina* provides their teens: (1) financial skills, (2) education, (3) employment opportunities, (4) self-care, and (5) "ADLs" acts of daily living. HHH hopes to augment this care with joint events and our **HHH Mentoring Program** to *Casa Valentna*'s teens this fall.

On hand to hear Ms. Graham's success stories were child welfare leaders **Maria Pia de Castro** (*UM's First Star Academy*), **Georgia Downey** (*Explore Foster Miami*), **Juliana Albino & Desiree Perez** (*Safe Families For Children*), and **Monica Farias** (*Catholic Charities' Unaccompanied Refugee Minors*).



HOPE, HEART & HOME MINISTRY A FAITH - BASED COMMUNITY COALITION SUPPORTING CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

If we told you a major and well-established risk factor in the top 10 causes of death in the United States and worldwide – received virtually no coverage in the media, would you be surprised?

And if this risk resulted not only in premature death but in significant increase in suicide, drug and alcohol abuse, brain damage, heart disease, stroke, diabetes, asthma, obesity, and depression – would that surprise you even more?

Well, all of this is true about Child Abuse, Abandonment, and Neglect!

All the painful scenes we have recently witnessed of immigrant families seeking asylum in the US along our southern border – and the heart-wrenching photos of children separated from their parent and being kept in cages – all of that pales in comparison to what pediatricians, child psychiatrists, psychologists, and the Department of Family Services (DCF) see daily in this country!

Last year 676,000 children were verified as "abuse and neglect" cases in the United States. Of those, 1700 died. That number is certainly much higher when human trafficking, malnourishment, and unreported violence is factored in. Today 437,000 children are in foster care, 2000 in Miami-Dade County alone.

HOPE, HEART & HOME MINISTRY was created to oversee a recruiting effort in the South Dade Deanery of the Archdiocese of Miami to support a coalition of child advocate groups committed to serve foster care in Miami. Over a dozen Catholic parishes have joined forces to team up with child welfare partners including Citrus Family Care Network, Guardian ad Litem, Voices For Children, Educate Tomorrow, Florida Foster Care Review, Children's Trust, Kristi House, His House, South Florida Foster and Adoptive Parents Association, One More Child, The Citrus FCN Youth Advisory Board (YAC), Explore Foster Miami, Casa Valentina, Children's Home Society, First Star, UM Law School, Safe Families for Children, Catholic Charities Unaccompanied Refugee Minor Program, Lifeline Children Services, Center for Family and Child Enrichment, and CAREPORTAL!

(1) FOSTER PARENTS

Children entering foster care due to child abuse, neglect, or abandonment need quality foster families to provide safe, nurturing, and loving homes where they can thrive and feel they belong. These children need support, comfort, and guidance during this difficult time in their lives. Foster parenting can be a short or long term commitment. *Citrus* provides *CARE* classes for interested parents.

(2) RESPITE PARENTS

Foster parents often need "breaks" during their time caring for children. Respite Parents provide that break by temporarily caring for children in their homes for short periods of time. Anyone interested in becoming a respite parent completes the same *CARE* training with *Citrus* that full-time foster parents go through.

(3) GUARDIAN AD LITEM

These same children also need court-appointed *Guardian as Litem (GAL)* to advocate for their best interests in dependency court procedures. Guardians make sure children are not lost in over-burdened legal and social service systems or languish in an inappropriate home or shelter. The *Guardians* require 30 hours of training, including on-line study and courtroom observation.

4) MENTORS

Teenage children "age-out" of dependent care at age 18. Studies have shown that teens who connect with a volunteer mentor achieve better grades, achieve higher graduation rates, and find better jobs. HHH Mentors will assist high school and college students navigate their way through college entrance, curriculum, "life questions," and career paths. Extensive training and background checks required.

(5) PANELISTS

Florida Foster Care Review conducts review sessions of pending cases before the Children's Court. They interview, screen, and train panelists to serve on civilian review "roundtables." Panelists serve one full day a month.

(6) CAREPORTAL NETWORKING

HHH needs Child Advocates to volunteer to help meet the specific needs of local foster families posted on the CarePortal platform. Anyone from 19 to 90 can join!
